I refuse to participate in the problem.



Make this week one where you do something you have never tried!



**Cultural Museum** 

Did you know that the Underground Railroad wasn't a railroad at all? It was a secret system of railroad terms that were used in helping fugitives escape slavery. Conductors (abolitionists) would send or receive parcels, dry goods or packages (Black men or women) to arranged destinations (safe houses). Various means of escape were used, by foot or in wagons with false bottoms or physical disguises. Freedom seekers crossing the border into Canada found refuge in various settlements throughout our province. Many settlements were stop-off places or terminals on the Underground Railroad leading to established communities such as Amhertsburg, Puce, Sandwich, Dresden, Chatham, North Buxton, Fort Erie, Niagara Falls, St. Catharines and Ancaster.

Now did you know that Owen Sound and Collingwood were the two most northern terminals????
