










Nick, from the Georgian Triangle Anglers Association delivered the brown trout eggs yesterday and answered some questions.



About 200 eggs were delivered. The eggs have just started to develop. If you look closely, you can see some of the developing fish moving inside the eggs.

The Brown Trout Life Cycle



Spawning

Between November and February a female thown thost digs a next or reddl in gravel analows. As who releases her eggs, they are fertilised by the male and then dovered with gravel. The gravels must be 10-40mm in size, loose and here of sits with plonty of oxygen rich water flowing through them. Check out the eggs the next time you are in the library. Do not tap the glass and try not to bump the table.



Adults

Adult trout have a territory that gives them a good supply of food and a place to hite from precisions, prefering deeper pools. In winter, they migrate, perhaps miles upriver, to spawn. Drown trout live up to 5-20 years.

Parr

Env and paer are transformed and solitary. They need plenty of cover in the inver hom stones, weed and training bankside plants, and shallow water that is not too fast flowing. Only around 5% of young trout survive their first year of Es.

Bring your buckets down after 2nd break A reminder that when you arrive on the school yard in the morning, cell phones are to be put away in your bags.






HELP US BOARD AND TRAVEL ON OUR BUSES SAFELY WOLFPACK!
