

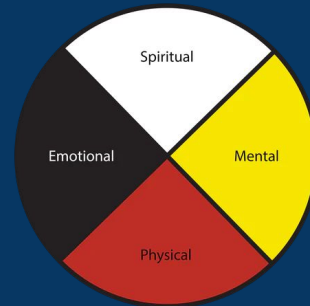

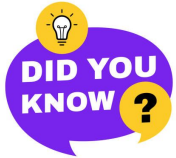

### A discussion prompt for families and children to explore and learn together:

We are sharing this choice board in recognition of Pride Month, a month where we celebrate the diversity of human relationships and families, recognize the history of LGBTQ+ changemakers and their allies, and work together to create more inclusive spaces for everyone. Discussions with your children about standing up for what is fair, interrupting exclusion and bullying, and being open to the diversity of all individuals and families, can make a positive impact on our school and community.

Kelp goes on a big journey in this book. **Can you make a timeline of the story that shows Kelp's journey?**

Kelp was fearful that his narwhal friends wouldn't accept Kelp once they found out that Kelp was a unicorn. How did they show that they did accept Kelp? How do you include others? **Write or draw your response.**

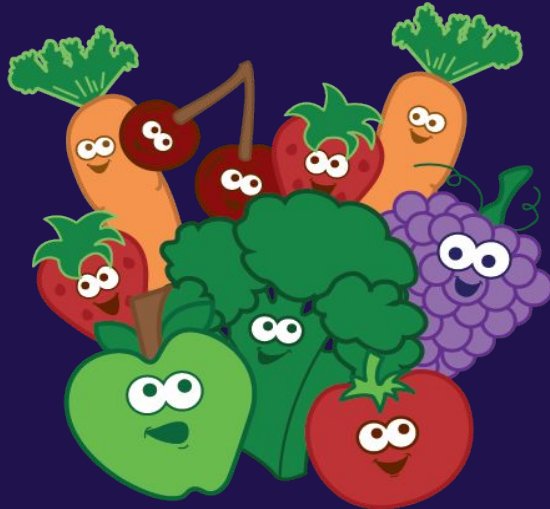
***Bring your buckets down after 2nd break***

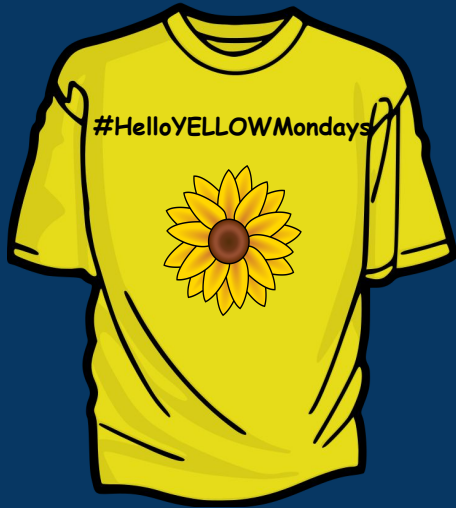
