

The Brown Trout Life Cycle



Spawning

Between November and February, a female brown trout digs a nest or reddt in gravel shallows. As she releases her eggs, they are ferillised by the male and then covered with gravel. The gravels must be 10-40mm in size, losse and free of sit with plonty of oxygen rich water flowing through them.



Adult trout have a territory that gives them a good supply of food and a place to hide from precisions, proforing deeper pools. In winter, they migrate, perhaps miles upriver, to spawn. Drown trout live up to 5 20 years.



Eggs

Eggs, 2-5mm in diameter, hatch into alevins in a few months, depending on temperature



Fry and peer are tentionial and solitary. They need plently of cover in the meer from stones, weed and training bankside plents, and shallow water that is not too fast flowing. Only around 5% of young trout survive their first year of 8%.



Nickins stay in the grover, liking off the yolk sac They then emerge as thy set up territories and converted year.

Some of the brown trout in the library have just finished using the food in their yolk sac and are starting to eat the fish food we are providing.



When the brown trout are ready to feed, they will swim to the top of the aquarium.



Alevins

Alevins stay in the gravel, living off the yolk sac. They then emerge as fry, set up territories and grow into parr.

Always be respectful to the duty teachers and to each other. Remember #we'vegotyourback


